# Bid to restore sanctity of Tirupati laddus continues

**SALVATION?** As matter reaches SC doorstep, AP announces formal cleansing of temples

The whirlwind around the allegations of the use of animal fat in Tirupati laddus spilled over to this week, with the Tirumala temple conducting a ritual to restore the sanctity of the prasadam and other naivedyams, to the matter reaching the Supreme Court. It all happened on Monday.

The events continued to unfold after Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu accused his predecessor YS Jagan Mohan Reddy-led Yuvajana Sramika Rythu Congress Party of using adulterated ghee that for preparing the laddus. Naidu announced the formation of SIT on Sunday, to probe the allegations of adulteration of Tirupati prasadam. The names of the members of team will be released in 2 to 3 days, said officials.

“We are forming a Special Investigation Team (SIT) comprising officers of IGP and senior posts. The SIT will submit a report to the government and we will take

action accordingly based on that report,” Naidu had said.

The SIT will investigate all issues, including procurement of adulterated ghee containing animal fat to prepare the prasadam and misuse of power by the previous dispensation. Furthermore, the CM has also said that only those who hold belief will be part of the management committee, followed by the standing operating procedures.

Meanwhile, the TTD authorities said, it has introduced changes in the procedure to buy pure cow ghee, adding that it will now be bought from recognised companies. The TTD has decided to set up a lab and a

panel with 18 people. The panel consists of trainees from the Central Food Technological Research Institute (CFTRI). The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has come forward to set up a lab from the Central government.

**PROBE SOUGHT**

Former MP Subramanian Swamy has filed a petition in the Supreme Court regarding the Tirumala Laddu controversy, seeking an investigation into Naidu’s allegations. Swamy stated that Chandrababu made these claims without providing any evidence.

Former Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) Chair-

man, YV Subba Reddy, has also sought the apex court’s intervention to probe into the allegations. The proposed committee should be led by a retired SC judge, he said.

**‘NO MISTAKES MADE’**

Meanwhile, former TTD Chairman and YSRCP leader Bhumana Karunakar Reddy after taking a holy bath in the Pushkarini and offering Karpur neerajanam to the deity at Akhilandam, affirmed that “no mistakes were made during his tenure as TTD Chairman”.

Furthermore, on September 21, the Andhra Pradesh government announced a review of cleanliness and quality standards in temples across the State. This includes the preparation of prasadam (offerings). Naidu emphasised that his administration will ensure strict quality checks for prasadam across temples. A formal cleansing process for temples is set to be initiated to uphold the sanctity and quality of temple practices. The government will consult with religious leaders and officials for the same.

# Congress limits Rahul Gandhi’s rallies in Haryana Assembly polls

The Congress is unlikely to use the star power of Rahul Gandhi in the Haryana assembly elections. This is because the party wants the election to remain focused on local issues which benefit it, given high anti-incumbency against the BJP government. Over-projecting Rahul runs the risk of it becoming a Modi-versus-Gandhi battle.

So far, Rahul has not addressed a single rally in the agrarian State, though only ten days remain for the poll campaign to end.

He has just visited the family of Amit Mann, who was injured in a truck accident in the US, in Karnal village on Friday, which the lead opposition party showcased as his concern for illegal immigration from the State due to lack of jobs.

**LOCAL LEADERS**

Party sources stated that it was a considered decision not to push Rahul much into electioneering in Haryana and leave local satraps like former Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, who is also contesting from

Garhi Sampla-Kiloi, his MP son Deepender Singh Hooda, MP Kumari Selja and other top party to do the talking.

Sources in the State party unit said he may, however, address a few rallies for which internal discussions are going on. On September 26, Rahul will address a meeting in Assandh in Karnal, Barwala in Hisar.

Rahul had addressed at least three public rallies during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections in Haryana. He spoke at Charkhi Dadri, Mahendragarh, and Sonipath to support party candidates contesting in nine out of ten Lok Sabha seats, with one seat left for ally Aam Admi Party (AAP).

**JAT CARD**

The Congress managed to win five seats largely due to the mobilisation of Jats and anti-incumbency against

former CM Manohar Lal Khattar’s regime.

The open rift between senior Hooda and Kumari Selja has become a cause of worry for Congress as the BJP is now fishing in troubled waters. Khattar has already given open offer to Selja to join the BJP. A tall Dalit leader, Selja feels sidelined for reasons such she has not being allowed to contest the Uklana assembly seat, which weakened her claim for the CM post.

Sources in the State Congress unit stated that Hooda is said to have prevailed upon the leadership to ensure that she gets into the fray and her loyalists do not get poll tickets. Selja has remained away from campaigning, forcing Rahul to ask Ashok Gehlot, who is in charge of the State, to tackle the issue.

Selja ruled out leaving Congress but did not hold back her anguish. “There are discussions within the party that we cannot share publicly. The party is progressing, and such matters are part of internal decision making,” Selja said. Dalits are key to the party’s prospects, as there are 17 reserved constituencies in Haryana. Now, she is expected to hold a rally on September 26 in Narvana.

## It’s a frugal campaign in Kashmir

The election expenditure of candidates rarely crosses ₹15-25 lakh

Remember how this March Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said no to contesting the Lok Sabha polls, saying she could not afford it. The popular perception is that to fight a Lok Sabha or Assembly election, you need vast sums of money and ritz campaigns. But candidates in Kashmir are showing the way in frugal electioneering.

**GRASSROOTS SUPPORT**  
On an average, candidates in the Valley have spent just between ₹15 lakh and ₹25 lakh, relying more on grassroots support.

Take the Shopian Assembly constituency, where Raja Waheed is contesting for Engineer Rashid’s Awami Ittehad Party. Waheed launched a boisterous campaign with dozens of his supporters on bikes and cars, following his modest cavalcade of two-three vehicles. He used bunting, flags and banners to spread his message in various pockets of the constituency.

According to Waheed, his campaign cost about ₹6-7 lakh. He said his supporters arranged their own vehicles and motorcycles to hit the campaign trail.

**MODEST SPEND**

*businessline* spoke to several candidates of constituencies that voted on September 18. All of them said their campaigns were quite frugal.

In 2022, the Election Commission of India raised the ceiling of election expenditure for both the Lok Sabha and Assembly polls, from ₹54-70 lakh to ₹75-90 lakh for the former and from ₹20-28 lakh to ₹28-40 lakh

for the latter. But most candidates in Kashmir are not even remotely close. National Conference leader Basheer Ahmad Veeri, who contested from Srigufwara-Bijbehara, said he spent about ₹15-17 lakh. Veeri attributed the low campaign costs to the fact that workers and supporters mostly used their own transport.

Jamaat-e-Islami-backed Talat Majeed, who contested from the Pulwama Assembly seat, told *businessline* that he spent around ₹2-2.5 lakh. “My workers arranged their refreshment and fuel for vehicles out of their own pockets,” he said.

## Govt issues show-cause notice to ghee supplier after Tirupati laddu row

The Health Ministry has issued a show-cause notice to one of the companies that supplied ghee to the Tirupati temple, sources said.

The notice has been sent by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), the government’s food regulatory authority.

Four samples of the concerned ghee-supplier were tested and all of them were found to be adulterated.

The temple had four ghee suppliers for making laddus and of these, samples of one of the suppliers were found to be reportedly adulterated. The supplier came under scrutiny after a report by NDDB CALF, a private laboratory specialising in testing animal feed and dairy products, found that ghee samples used in these laddus contained foreign fats and non-dairy products, including palm oil, fish oil, beef tallow, and lard (pig fat).

According to a senior Health Ministry official, ghee by definition “has to

made from milk” and is considered as a “dairy product”. “Depending on the response, action will be taken against the supplier as per provisions of food regulation and adulteration acts in the country,” the official said.

**FSSAI NOTICE**

In its notice, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India has sought reasons from the ghee-supplier as to why its central license shall not be suspended “for contravention”. (*businessline* has reviewed a copy of the show-cause notice)

**MONKEY POX CASE**

Health Ministry sources confirmed that a 38-year-old from Kerala who contracted monkeypox has been infected with the MPOX Clade-I strain. This is the first case of the strain in the country. The Kerala resident had returned from UAE and contract tracing in reportedly underway.

There are two distinct clades of the virus – Clade-I (which includes sub-categories like Clade 1a and 1b) and Clade-II with (subclades include 1Ia and 1Ib). In August, WHO declared MPOX

outbreak a public health emergency of international concern.

## Amazon India to buy land from Lodha for new generative AI data centre

Amazon India is in the final stages of buying around 40-45 acres of land in Palava, near Mumbai, from Macrotech Developers for around ₹500-600 crore, where it plans to set up a data centre for Amazon Web Services’ generative AI applications, sources said.

The deal will likely be finalised in the next few months, said sources with direct knowledge of the deal. After the land acquisition, the company will build the data centre for the e-commerce giant, they added.

There were no responses from the Amazon India communications team or Macrotech Developers to emails seeking clarifications.

**CAPACITY**

Generative AI takes artificial intelligence one step further and helps organisations devise solutions and applications never thought of before. The data centre capacity needed to support GenAI differs from that required for cloud workloads regarding power, space, and cooling.

Amazon Web Services provides cloud technologies on which companies, organ-

isations, and institutes can build solutions to offer their services. It has about 31 per cent market share in cloud infrastructure globally, according to Statista, ahead of Microsoft’s Azure and Google Cloud Platform. India is a key market for AWS, which has the largest footprint outside the US, having spent \$3.7 billion in the country between 2016 and 2022, primarily in the AWS Asia Pacific (Mumbai) Region.

Last year, Amazon had said it would be investing \$12.7 billion in building up its data centre infrastructure network in India by the end of the decade. AWS has two data centre infrastructure regions in India: the Mumbai region, which was launched in 2016, and the Hyderabad region, which was launched in 2022. The two AWS regions are designed to provide Indian customers with options to run workloads with even greater resilience and availability, securely store data in India, and serve end users with low latency.

In May 2023, it leased around 4.5 lakh sq ft of land from K Raheja Corp in Navi Mumbai for 15 years to set up a data centre. In 2022, it had leased 5.5 acres of land from Larsen & Toubro in Powai for the same purpose.

## India may add 23 GW solar power capacity in 2024

Solar power capacity addition in India, the world’s fourth largest renewable energy market, is expected to grow at a healthy 77 per cent Y-o-Y to 23 gigawatts (GW) in the current calendar year (CY), a report by Ember said.

India, which added more solar power capacity in the first five months of CY 2024 than the entire 2023, along with China, the US, Germany and Brazil is on track to account for 75 per cent of the world’s solar capacity addition in 2024.

Last year witnessed a lower number of installations amid uncertainty around government rules on solar manufacturing. Installations skyrocketed in March this year, before new policy changes came into place which mandated that solar modules used in government-backed projects have to be sourced from an Approved List of Models and Manufacturers (ALMM), the report said.

“However, growth since then has remained steady, and by July the country had installed 18 GW of solar capacity, equalling its all-time record for annual solar panel installations from 2022. At the current pace of additions, India is on track to install 23 GW by the end of 2024, up 77 per cent compared to 2023,” it added.
