## Russia Buys More from India as Kenya Tea Turns Costlier

**Kolkata:** Russia is purchasing more tea from India at a cheaper price as supplies from Kenya have become costlier. India's tea exports to Russia were 5% higher in the first eight months of 2022 compared with a year earlier, though the price realisation fell 13% per kg as that country is buying cheaper tea from South India.

Russia, which prefers orthodox tea, is also now purchasing common variety CTC teas amid growing tea bag culture in the country.

Russia is the fifth largest buyer of Kenyan tea. But in recent weeks, Kenyan tea prices have started moving northward. Data from East African Tea Trade Association show that the price of tea has increased to Rs 2.57 (ETR) a kg now from Rs 2.37 a few weeks ago.

Mohit Agarwal, a director at Asian Tea Company, said: "Russia is buying tea from South India now. They are lesser in price compared to Assam teas. So, there is a drop in unit price realisation."

During January-August 2022, Russia and CIS countries together bought 30.36 million kg of tea from India. The average price offered was Rs 164.88 per kg as compared with Rs 181.52 a year earlier. Some planters said the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war had impacted the price offered by Russia in purchasing Indian tea.

What has helped the tea industry to offset the loss to some extent was the rise in tea prices in Iran and the UAE, two other major buyers of Indian tea, Agarwal said.

Iran has offered Rs 272.50 per kg as compared to Rs 258.73 last year, while the UAE has bought Indian tea at Rs 301.49 per kg, much higher than last year's Rs 247. Saudi Arabia has offered Rs 304.28 for Indian tea.

Agarwal said the Middle Eastern countries had offered good prices for Indian tea this year. "Exports are going strong and the industry is hopeful to achieve 225 million kg of exports this year," he added.

## Pact with Russian co Uralkali Likely for Potash Fert Supply

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**New Delhi:** India is likely to strike a long-term supply deal with Russian potash fertilizer producer and exporter Uralkali, said a senior official of department of fertilizers. The country is aiming to strike a deal for supply of 1 million tonnes of potash fertilizers. The imports will be contracted between Uralkali and 4-5 Indian companies, the source said without revealing the names of the companies.

"The focus is to have secure supplies at reasonable rates," the official said without wanting to be named. The move is a part of the government's efforts to hedge against high global prices and geopolitical instability.

The two countries have formed a committee to chalk out the details of the deal. The committee is headed by the secretary of the department of fertilizer and his counterpart in the Russian trade ministry to facilitate the deal between companies.

India meets 100% of its potash requirement through imports. It imports approximately 46 lakh tonnes of MOP (mineral Potash), which is a source of potassium, is used both for direct application as MOP (Muriate of Potash) as well as in combination with Nitrogen (N) and Phosphorus (P), nutrients in NPK fertilizers.

Recently, three Indian companies - Coromandel International, Chempak Fertilizers and Indian Potash - have signed a pact with Canada-based Canpotex for the import of 35 lakh tonnes of potash annually for three years, according to the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers.

India is one of the biggest importers of fertilizers in the world and Russia has emerged as a key supplier. India allows fertilizer companies to fix the retail prices of fertilizers but provides subsidies to them.

## Exporters Flag EU Withdrawal of GSP and Ocean Freight Tax

Concerned over demand slowdown in China and US, export duty on stainless steel

**New Delhi:** Withdrawal of EU Generalised System of Preferences (GSP) for certain sectors, goods and services tax on ocean freight, export duty on stainless steel, longer period of realisation and repatriation of export proceeds, and a demand slowdown in China and the US are some concerns exporters flagged with the government amid slowing growth of merchandise shipments.

India's goods exports growth has slowed to low single digits in the second quarter of FY23 and a contraction is expected in October and November.

Exporters said India's exports of plastics, stone, machinery and mechanical appliances worth \$7.9 billion to the EU will no longer be eligible for low or zero duty concessions from January 2023. They have also sought the benefits of the Refund of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) scheme to be extended to pharmaceuticals, chemicals and steel products as they're excluded at present.

Steel is a key input in engineering goods whose exports shrank 10.85% on-year in September.

"Engineering exports have been de-

clining for the last two months because of the Russia-Ukraine crisis, and gas crisis in the EU. Export duty on certain steel products, and GST on ocean and air freight are also adding to the challenges," said Engineering Export Promotion Council India chairman Arun Kumar Guroodia.

The issues were raised at a meeting that commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal had with export promotion councils on Monday.

Citing low global liquidity, the Federation of Indian Export Organisations pitched for a longer period of realisa-

tion and repatriation of export proceeds which is nine months at present. The longer period can be used as a marketing tool to push exports, it said.

The gems and jewellery sector highlighted the issue of constrained supply of gold due to various compliance while chemical exporters sought RoDTEP benefits.

Sources said that rising imports of raw materials and intermediates from China but slow growth in exports from India to China and the US were discussed besides restating e-visas for tourists from the UK and Canada.

## Exporters Face Contract Defaults by Sugar Millers

Allege backtracking due to higher global prices

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crushing operation. Indian sugar millers are now demanding an additional Rs 150 quintal from exporters. Merchant exporters told ET that currently they are witnessing mass default by the millers, especially from Maharashtra.

The exporters have also alleged that the sugar mills are also forming cartels to demand specific rate for export sugar.

"Some exporters are facing large-scale defaults on export commitments by the sugar mills from Maharashtra, which is not good for the country's reputation in the global market," said Suryajit Dagaonkar, president (trading) at Baranasi Agro Ltd, a Pune-based agribusiness conglomerate with interest in sugar, animal feed, and food processing among others.

Indian exporters had started contracting to export sugar from August onward, much before the government came out with its sugar export policy for 2022-23 this weekend. Mills had contracted to sell low-grade white and raw sugar to exporters of ₹2,250/quintal to ₹3,000/quintal.

However, as world sugar prices continue to stay firm due to a restricted export quota of India and excess rainfall in Brazil that may delay its availability, the sugar in the international market.

Some exporters, though, are in the process of taking the defaulting mills to the courts to enforce the contracts, ET has learnt.

"Such defaults are not good for the reputation of the state, and the regulating government authorities should take necessary actions to prevent it," said Abhijit Gharpade, a sugar broker.
